To all filmmakers and aspiring filmmakers 21 and under in the Seattle area and beyond:

- Have you produced a film on the environment, poverty, racism, biotechnology, worker rights, LGBT or women's issues, or other social justice issues?
- Do you have an idea for a film on these subjects and especially on prisoner justice issues?
- Do you have a project that is half finished and you just need an extra nudge to complete it?

Now is the time!!!

Please submit your film, feature or short, documentary or narrative, to the 2nd Social Justice Film Festival, which will take place in Seattle October 10-13, with a special focus on prisoner justice. Books to Prisoners, is the lead sponsor.* Be part of the "Youth Visions" competition, which the festival is sponsoring to encourage young adults (21 and under) to produce innovative films on issues of prisoner justice. On our closing night, awards will be made in the categories of Best Feature Film, Best Documentary Feature, Best Narrative Short, and Best Documentary Short.

Social justice topics:

The environment (Hanford, global warming), food and agriculture (GMOs, sugar/fat/salt, hunger, food deserts), LGBT rights, women's issues, racial equality, debt slavery (student debt), and economic justice (Occupy Wall Street). But these are just examples; social justice issues are all around you.


Prisoner Justice focus:

Prisoner literacy and education, three strikes, the death penalty, the Innocence Project, New Jim Crow, the drug war, juvenile justice, solitary confinement, immigration and detention, prison alternatives, incarcerated mothers, and the prison industrial complex.
